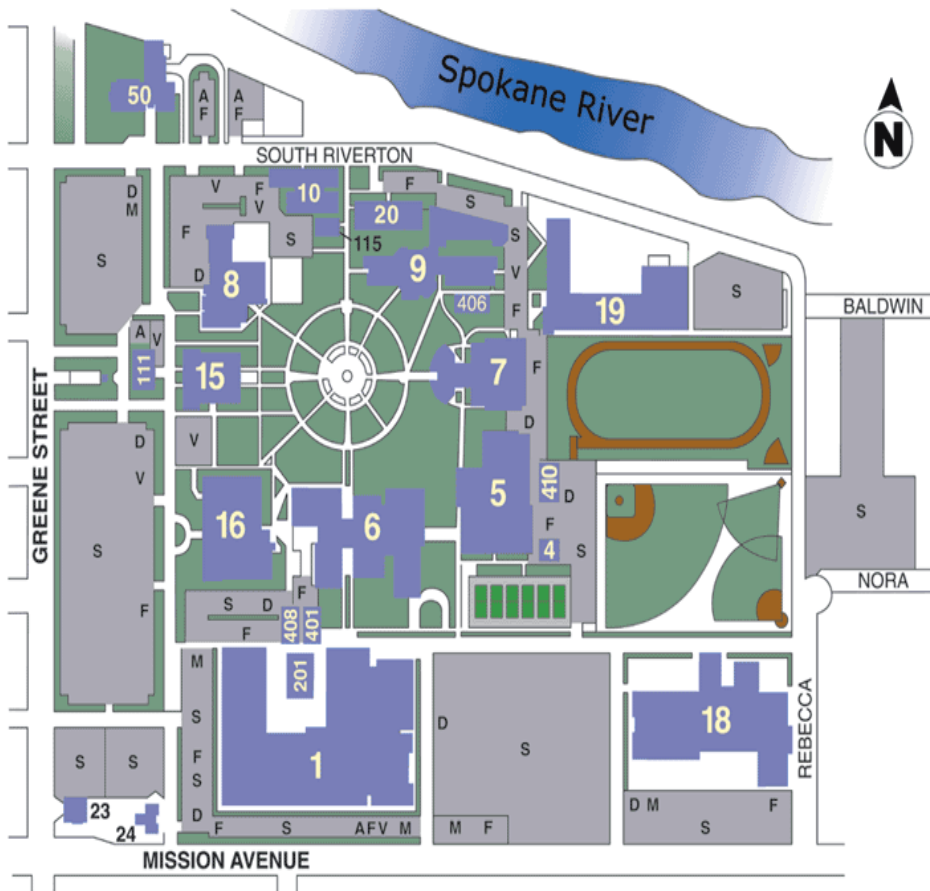
Getting to Spokane Community College (SCC)

From I-90 Eastbound:

1. Take the Thor/Freya St. exit.
2. Turn left at Thor St. (Thor St. will become Thor Place)
3. Thor Place will become Freya St. when you cross Sprague Ave.
4. Continue traveling north on Freya St. Freya will become Greene St. at Mission Ave. The SCC campus is located at the intersection of Greene St. and Mission Ave. You may enter the campus from Greene St. or from Mission Ave.

From I-90 Westbound:

1. Take the Thor/Freya St. exit.
2. Travel two blocks west to Thor St. and turn right at the stoplight (Thor St. will become Thor Place).
3. Thor Place will become Freya St. when you cross Sprague Ave.
4. Continue traveling north on Freya. Freya will become Greene St. at Mission Ave. The SCC campus is located at the intersection of Greene St. and Mission Ave. You may enter the campus from Greene St. or from Mission Ave.
