Dear Lake Users and Advocates:

The Washington Lake Protection Association (WALPA) is comprised of a diverse group of individuals that share the common goal of protecting and enhancing Washington lakes. Over the years, WALPA has found that the most effective way to achieve this goal is through public outreach and education. Through our annual lake conference and public speaking appearances, our organization facilitates a statewide forum to educate the public on lake issues. Many of the issues concerning lakes are complex and changing. Yet, for effective management decisions to be made, a clear understanding is necessary. So that WALPA can better serve Washington's lake communities, we are interested in your opinions regarding lake issues.

The next 3 pages contain a survey. The intent of this survey is to better understand the views of lake association members, and lakeside property owners, regarding the conservation and stewardship of Washington lakes. The results of this survey will then be used by WALPA to develop informational conference sessions, scientific presentations, and to inform state and county natural resource management agencies.

The survey uses a ranking system from 1 to 5 (1 is of least importance and 5 of greatest importance). While each of the items on this survey may appear to be important, please attempt to distinguish the issues as they pertain to your lake. (A completed survey with a response of 5 for all of the issues [all very important] will be of limited use to us.) For example, if your lake does not currently have a problem with Eurasian watermilfoil infestation (a type of aquatic weed) and you do not have reason to suspect it will be invaded by milfoil in the foreseeable future please answer 1 (unimportant). This does not mean that you are uninterested in milfoil infestations, it merely means that at this time it is not an important concern for your lake.

Once you have answered each of the 50 questions, please list the 5 issues (from the list) that concern you the most. You may also list 3 items of particular concern that may not have been included on this survey.
