Pacific Northwest floodplain sites such as gravel pits and oxbow lakes often create lake-like conditions conducive to undesirable cyanobacteria growth. Ross Island Lagoon is one such active gravel dredging site that has become a recurring, late summer HAB contamination source for the Portland harbor of the Willamette River. Just upriver a previously dredged site, Clackamette Cove, is being considered for development.
